
Draft is only 48 Days Away


The Matador maneuvers around Chico

grace and ease". states the Matador




La Bamba makes the first pass out. "The first pass out of your zone is the most important pass you can make in a game, boys and girls" Says the teacher, La Bamba

Rocky Decided to sign up for the race back in July here is his take on the run: I just wanted to run through the tunnel and over the bridge. Never ran anything but a 5k before. I ran 3 times per week basically since July (one hard 5k, light mid-distance run, long run on Sundays). I got to the start line just 10 minutes before the 7am start time. It was cold, still dark and a little breezy but with 20k plus runners, very exciting. My plan was to start off easy and really soak in the experience. Once at the peak of the bridge, it was time to step it up and hit my target pace (5 minutes per KM).

Funny thing happened on the bridge...my iphone, which I use to listen to music as I run, slipped out of my armband and went bouncing and sliding down the road surface. Lucky it did not break or get stepped on by the other runners. I picked it up and managed to get it back in the armband as kept my pace down the bridge. Daylight arrived as we came off the bridge and felt awesome running down Riverside drive. Saw Hurricane along there and yelled out to him. Was great hearing "Rocky" on the course.

Rocky tells his story.....

My daughters were on the course in front of the Chrysler building so I stopped to give them a hug and kiss and kept on going.

The tunnel was the hardest part of the race. It is hot down there, and the climb up to the US side is steeper than it appears when you drive through. It was the only time I felt tired and slow. Once back on Jefferson Ave in Detroit, the cool air helped me get back to a comfortable state and I got back on pace.

We ran west through Corktown and enjoyed all the funny signs people held...one said "I don't do marathons but I do marathoners!"

It was great making the turn back on to Fort Street and seeing the finish line with spectators packed along the sides. I heard my name mentioned as a crossed the line at 1:50. I had a stretch goal of 1:45 but was happy with 1:50 or less so I guess it was a success.

I may run again next year but if so, I will really try to push myself and try to break the 1:40 barrier. No intentions on ever doing a full marathon. That is just crazy.
